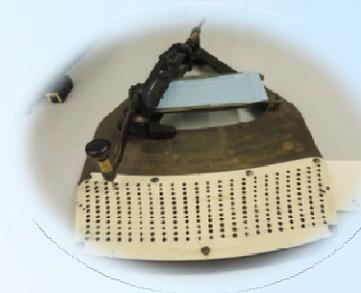

Data Processing with the Punch Card

From the 1890 U.S. Census until into the 1990s the Punch Card played a significant role in the processing of data.



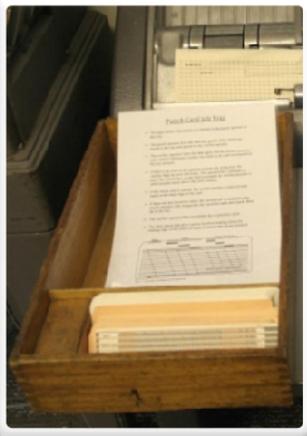
1889 Pantograph

From exposed mechanical and electrical components, through heavy cast iron machines with Queen Anne legs, to smooth lines and wheels, punch card hardware developed in sophistication. Known collectively as Unit Record Equipment, these pieces of hardware formed the cornerstone of data processing even into the 1990s.

The chart overleaf shows a typical workflow, illustrated with the machines of the 1940s and 1950s. These were the last line of Unit Record machines that were developed by IBM.
